Ian,

Thank you so much for calling me this morning. I am cc'ing Bryon Hadwick and Dick Mackey from the Central Modoc RCD so they have the correct information.

You are contracted by the Honey Lake Valley RCD to develop the Susan River Integrated Regional Water Management Plan for their region. The Surprise Valley area which is located in the Lahontan Region is currently not included in any region and therefore would not be eligible for any Prop 84 funding or might not be eligible for any funding from future water bond propositions due to not being covered in an IRWM Region.

I spoke with Michael Ward from DWR and in turn he called you to discuss the possibility of including Surprise Valley in your region. I thought Michael had told me on a voice message that the Susan River IRWMP planning grant had enough money in it to include Surprise Valley. Apparently that is not the case. The Susan River is also far enough into the process that it would be almost impossible to add the information to the needed chapters at this time also. It was suggested that maybe the Susan River IRWM RWMG might consider including Surprise Valley into their regional map by expanding the identified boundaries. This will leave it up to the stakeholders in Surprise Valley or the Central Modoc District Boundaries to come up with the funding in the future to add an appendix or edit some of the chapters with information needed to go into the Susan River IRWMP.

I am sure someone will be calling you to find out the best way to make sure that Surprise Valley is included in a recognized IRWM region.

Again thank you and hope this works well for everyone.



The Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) regions within the Lahontan Funding Area have been working collaboratively regarding the CA Department of Water Resources (DWR) Proposition 84 IRWM Program. The IRWM regions wish to work together to equitably distribute Proposition 84 funds to the regions, rather than a "winner takes all" approach to grant applications. In pursuit of this collaboration, the regions have developed a proposal to distribute Proposition 84 funds, as follows:

- The entirety of available Proposition 84 IRWM funds available to the Lahontan Funding Area would be divided among eligible IRWM regions. For current and future rounds of Proposition 84 grants, no IRWM region will request more than their remaining allocation of funds.
- Prop 84 IRWM funds of \$24.7 million (\$27 million less DWR admin and bond financing costs) will be divided two ways among the IRWM regions (dollar amounts allocated to each IRWM region shown in attachment):
  1. 50% of funds divided equally among Regions.
  2. 50% of funds divided in proportion to each region's population.

The Tahoe Sierra IRWM Region supports the proposal described above, and has agreed to request only up to the amount of funds allocated to the Region, for the remainder of Proposition 84 grant applications. We believe this proposal will give some certainty to the regions in the Lahontan Funding Area as to the amount of grant funds they can anticipate to receive via Proposition 84. This will help the regions to more adequately plan for future IRWM projects and programs. We urge DWR to support this proposal, and to award grant funds accordingly.
